Susan Sarback, artist, author, and art instructor founded the School of Light and Color, in Fair Oaks, CA, in 1986.

After years of studying both abstract painting and representational art, she was still searching for a deeper understanding about light and color. She discovered Henry Hensche, an American Impressionist painter in the lineage of Charles Hawthorne, William Merrit Chase, and Claude Monet. After years of in-depth study with this master painter, she began to uncover the deep secrets about light and color that she had searched for throughout her life.

Trained in the lineage of the Impressionist painters, she has taught artists from all over the world how to enliven their work by seeing and painting with a broader understanding of light and color.
